Name of the Event	Description
Independence Day	Every year on August 15th, India observes Independence Day as a public holiday to mark the nation's independence from the United Kingdom on that day in 1947, when the provisions of the Indian Independence Act took effect, transferring legislative authority to the Indian Constituent Assembly.
Republic Day	India observes Republic Day as a national holiday to commemorate the 26th of January 1950, when the Indian Constitution went into effect. This took the place of the Government of India Act 1935 as the country's governing law, transforming India into a republic distinct from the British Raj. The Indian Constituent Assembly ratified the constitution on November 26, 1949, and it went into effect on January 26, 1950. The date of January 26 was chosen as Republic Day since it was on that day in 1930 that the Indian National Congress proclaimed the Declaration of Indian Independence.
Constitution Day	India observes Constitution Day, also known as Samvidhan Divas, on November 26 each year. This day also coincides with the 133rd birth anniversary of Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar, the chairman of the drafting committee of the Constituent Assembly, who played a pivotal role in shaping the Indian Constitution. Initially celebrated as Law Day, the day was renamed Constitution Day by the Indian government in 2015.
Human Rights Day	This day marks the 75th anniversary of one of the world's most groundbreaking global pledges: the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR). This landmark document enshrines the inalienable rights that everyone is entitled to as a human being - regardless of race, colour, religion, sex, language, political or other opinion, national or social origin, property, birth or other status. The Constitution of India incorporates many of these pledges in the form of fundamental rights which we all enjoy.

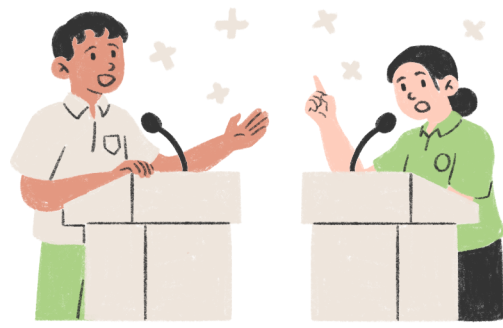


Guardians of the DRMOCRACY – A Test of Knowledge and Rhetoric

Round 1 of several exciting events will unfold, providing participants the opportunity to showcase their knowledge and skills related to constitutional principles. The Debate Competition will see teams of two (Proposition and Opposition) engage in dynamic discussions, with participants presenting their arguments for 3 minutes, followed by rebuttals in a 2-minute round. The Extempore Speech will challenge participants to think on their feet, as they draw random topics and present a 5-minute speech, evaluated based on creativity, coherence, and delivery. In the Quiz Competition, teams of up to three members will compete in multiple rounds, testing their knowledge of constitutional history, landmark judgments, and rapid-fire questions on constitutional principles. The Essay Writing Contest will encourage participants to critically engage with constitutional themes through well-researched essays, focusing on originality, depth of analysis, and writing proficiency, with submissions due by the end of the day. This engaging day promises intellectual rigor and provides participants with a platform to demonstrate their understanding of India's legal framework, their oratory and writing abilities, and their quick-thinking skills.

Debate Competition



The Debate Competition is a dynamic event that challenges participants to engage with constitutional principles through structured argumentation and critical thinking. In this event, teams will consist of two participants—one representing the Proposition and the other representing the Opposition. Each team will debate a constitutional topic, defending their stance while addressing opposing arguments, demonstrating the importance of both preparation and adaptability.

Topic Selection

Round 1 topics will be given prior. At the start of the event, participants will draw topics randomly through a chit system. This random draw ensures fairness and tests participants' ability to quickly form arguments on a variety of constitutional themes, be it on fundamental rights, judicial review, or the balance of power between the branches of government. The spontaneity of topic selection adds an element of challenge and excitement to the event.

Judging Criteria

The debate will be judged based on three primary criteria: Content Relevance, Argumentation, and Presentation.

- **Content Relevance:** The judges will evaluate how well participants adhere to core constitutional principles and the accuracy of legal references in their arguments. Speeches should align with established constitutional norms, drawing on relevant case laws and legal texts.
- **Argumentation:** The strength of the team's arguments will be assessed based on the logical flow of ideas, the effective use of evidence, and the strength of counter-arguments. Strong debaters must not only present compelling arguments but also respond effectively to the points made by the opposing side.
- **Presentation:** Presentation is key in a debate. Judges will look at the speaker's confidence, clarity of expression, and their ability to engage the audience through effective body language and tone. A well-delivered speech will captivate the audience and judges alike, making the difference between a winning and losing argument.

Time Allotment

Each speaker will be allotted a maximum of 3 minutes to present their stance on the topic. This time limit encourages concise and impactful delivery, forcing participants to articulate their arguments clearly within a short period.

After the initial speeches, a Rebuttal Round will take place. During this round, each team will have 2 minutes to respond to the key arguments made by the opposing team. The rebuttal phase is crucial for highlighting flaws in the opponent's arguments and reinforcing the strength of their own position. Effective rebuttals are key to swaying the judges and potentially turning the tide in the team's favor.

Extempore Speech Challenge



The Extempore Speech Challenge offers participants an exciting opportunity to showcase their spontaneous speaking abilities while engaging with key constitutional themes. In this dynamic competition, participants will be required to deliver a 5-minute impromptu speech on a randomly drawn topic related to the Constitution, justice, or societal issues, making it an excellent test of their critical thinking and rhetorical skills.

Topic selection- Round 1 topics will be given prior. Participants will draw topics randomly just before their turn, ensuring a fair and unbiased selection. This unique format tests their ability to think on their feet, adapt quickly to unexpected themes, and formulate a structured and coherent speech under time pressure.

Speech Duration- Each participant will have a maximum of 5 minutes to present their speech. The time limit encourages concise delivery, while allowing participants to articulate their thoughts clearly and persuasively within a set framework.

Judging Criteria- The speeches will be evaluated based on the following criteria :

Creativity and Originality- The judges will look for fresh perspectives and innovative ideas. Participants should aim to present a unique take on the topic, offering insights that demonstrate both depth and creativity. The originality of the thought process will be key in making their speech stand out from the rest.

Coherence of Arguments

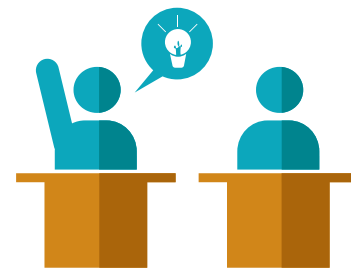
A well-organized speech is essential for clear communication. Participants will be judged on their ability to structure their arguments logically, ensuring that their points are clearly connected and follow a natural flow. Clarity of thought and logical consistency will be highly valued, as the speech should be easy for the audience to follow and understand.

Delivery and Engagement

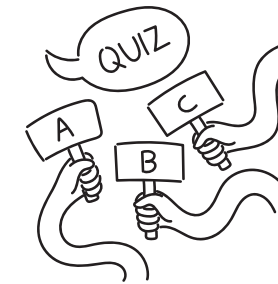
Effective delivery is as important as the content of the speech. Participants will be assessed on their tone of voice, body language, and eye contact. The ability to project confidence and engage the audience is critical. Speakers should aim to captivate their listeners by maintaining interest throughout the speech, using dynamic expressions, and modulating their voice to emphasize key points. The overall impact of the presentation will be a key factor in the judging process.

Quiz Competition



The Quiz Competition is designed to test participants' knowledge of constitutional law, its historical foundations, and the landmark judgments and amendments that have shaped India's legal system. Teams of up to three members each will compete across multiple rounds, engaging in a battle of wits and quick thinking. This competition will require a deep understanding of the Indian Constitution and its application in real-world legal scenarios.

Team Structure

Each team will consist of up to three members, allowing participants to combine their individual expertise and work together to answer questions efficiently. Teamwork will be key in this competition, as each member brings a unique perspective, and collaboration will ensure that the team is well-prepared for the varied rounds of the quiz.

Competition Rounds

The quiz will unfold in three rounds, each designed to test participants on different aspects of constitutional knowledge. The Preliminary Round will cover general knowledge of constitutional law and history. Participants will answer questions related to the Constitution's origins, its framers, and the key elements that structure India's legal and political system. This round will assess participants' overall familiarity with constitutional principles and their historical context.

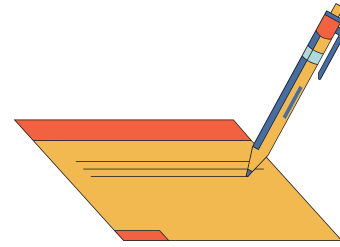

Judging Criteria

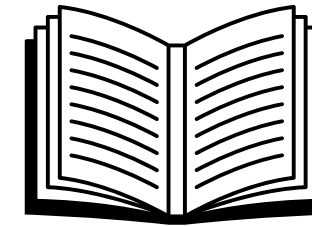
The quiz will be judged based on two main criteria: accuracy and speed. Accuracy will be the foremost consideration, as correct answers are essential to progressing in the competition. Teams must demonstrate a solid understanding of constitutional law, landmark rulings, and historical facts. The second important factor is the time taken to respond. Faster responses will be rewarded, particularly in the Final Round, where the pressure to deliver correct answers quickly will intensify. This round tests not just knowledge, but the ability to think and react under time constraints.

Essay Writing Contest

Word Limit

The essay should be between 1,000 and 1,500 words. This range allows participants enough space to explore their topic thoroughly while maintaining clarity and focus in their writing. The word limit encourages participants to be concise yet comprehensive in presenting their analysis.

Submission Deadline

Essays must be submitted by the end of the event day. This deadline will ensure that the writing process remains focused and timely, encouraging participants to complete their work in a structured manner while adhering to the constraints of the competition.

Judging Criteria

The essays will be evaluated based on the following criteria:

- **Originality and Depth of Analysis:** Judges will look for essays that present fresh insights and in-depth analysis. The ability to explore constitutional themes from unique angles, backed by critical thinking, will be highly valued. Originality in both approach and argumentation will be a key factor in determining the strength of the essay.
- **Adherence to the Theme:** It is essential that the essay remains focused on the theme provided for the competition. The content must be relevant and should directly address the constitutional issues outlined in the theme. Essays that stray from the central topic will be penalized.
- **Language Proficiency and Structure:** Clear, precise, and well-organized writing is crucial. Judges will assess the language proficiency, including grammar, vocabulary, and clarity of expression. Additionally, the essay must be well-structured, with a clear introduction, body, and conclusion. A logical flow of ideas, proper use of paragraphs, and smooth transitions will contribute to the overall readability and effectiveness of the essay.

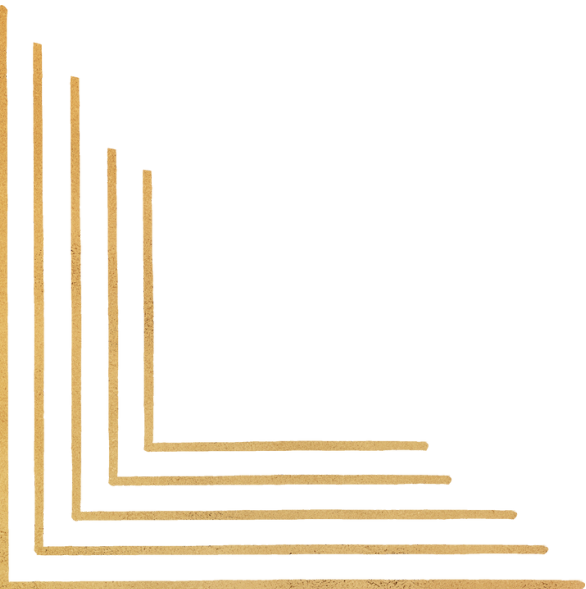

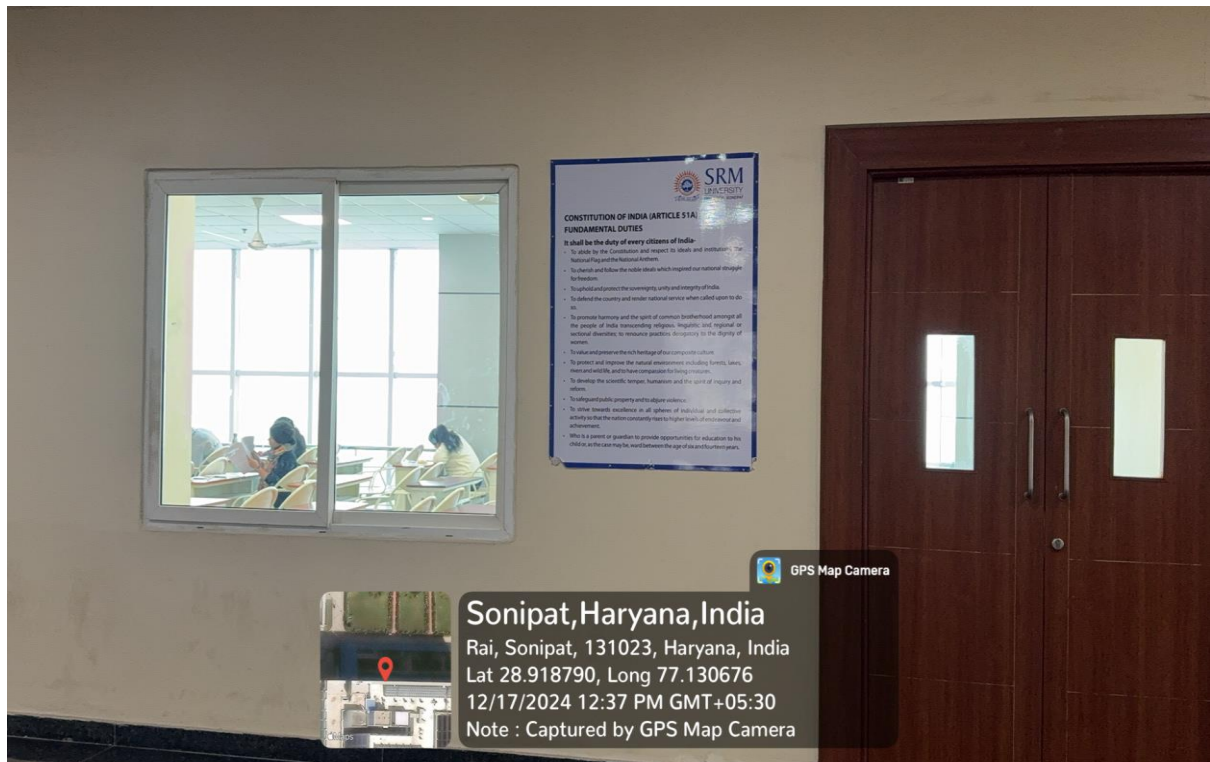

"US President-Elect and the implications for India"

On November 20th, 2024, the Department of Political Science, Faculty of Science & Humanities of SRM University, Delhi-NCR, organised a special lecture on the topic "US President-Elect and the Implications for India." The guest speaker of the event was Prof. (Dr.) Satish Kumar from Indira Gandhi National Open University, Delhi, who shared his expertise on the subject.

The lecture began with an introduction by Mr. Deepak Tomar, who welcomed the guest and highlighted the importance of analysing the geopolitical and bilateral implications of the recent US presidential elections. The lecture was attended by students and faculty members to understand how the changing leadership in the United States could impact India.

Prof. Satish Kumar began the discussion by contextualizing the global significance of the United States in contemporary international relations. He emphasized that today's driving forces are predominantly economic rather than military. He highlighted how the world is witnessing significant changes in international relations, particularly in areas like Global Power Dynamics, in which he discussed the emergence of a new world order with shifting alliances and the rise of China as a significant economic competitor to the USA. He also delved into the complex trade relationships and their influence on global stability.

On the topic of Indo-US relations, he discussed the evolving nature of these bilateral ties, including trends in trade balance that have favoured India in recent decades. He also touched upon potential changes in visa policies and their implications, as well as the strategic importance of the Indian diaspora in the United States. Furthermore, Prof. Satish Kumar addressed the ongoing Russia-Ukraine situation, the dynamics in the Middle East, and their far-reaching global implications. He also explored the role of NATO and its changing position in international affairs. From an economic standpoint, the lecture covered discussions on tariff policies and their impact on trade, the role of emerging economies in global markets, and the focus on economic stability and sustainable development.

Prof. Satish Kumar also highlighted climate change as a pressing concern, with discussions around the shift towards renewable energy and its implications for India's energy security. The lecture addressed the strategic importance of the Quad (India, US, Japan, and Australia) and the need for its members to be militarily equipped to deter China. However, Prof. Kumar emphasised that India will not go to war with China, as it aims to maintain a delicate balance in its foreign policy. He also discussed the issue of illegal immigrants from India to the US, estimated to be over 7 lakhs, which was also raised, underscoring the need for India to be cautious about over-reliance on the US, given its own interests.

As a student, what struck me most was the comprehensive way in which Prof. Satish Kumar connected various global events to their potential impact on India's future. The lecture wasn't just an academic exercise but a wake-up call to understand our place in the rapidly changing global order. The event was concluded with an engaging Q&A session where students actively participated, showing the deep interest our student community has in international affairs and India's global position.

The event ended with a vote of thanks by the students, who expressed gratitude to Prof. Satish Kumar for his time and valuable insights. It was truly an eye-opening session that gave us a better understanding of

how interconnected the world is and how important the US-India partnership is for shaping global policies.

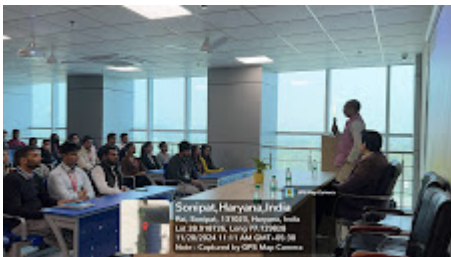
