- Students with 89-91.9% in XII examination are eligible for 50% scholarship in tuition fees.
- Students with 80-88.9% in XII examination are eligible for 25% scholarship in tuition fees.
- Students with 75-79.9% in XII examination are eligible for 10% scholarship in tuition fees.

Scholarship from 10-100% is subject to the valid score of SRMHCAAT.
